Now let's talk about leading through change. It seems that I have been engaged in change my whole life, both personally and professionally. For years I thought you had to "help" people see the value of change through force, coercion, or "just get on with it." That thinking may have been a reflection of managerial approaches from the last half of the 20th century. But those practices, and my approaches to change were shaped and modified as we collectively progressed to a more inclusive approach.

The 21st century ushered in change tools such as: Quality is Free, Total Quality Management, growth of ISO 9000, Six Sigma, and Lean Thinking. All have been a large part of our collective drive toward high-quality performance, change management and change leadership. Some approaches, such as Baldrige (Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award), provide a framework for self-

assessment.

One of the benefits of a process framework approach is that it tends to not be dogmatic. It doesn't insist that there is only one true way to your vision, mission and values. Tools such as the Baldrige Framework provide questions on approach and implementation as well as results. Through KyCPE, leaders have the opportunity to collaborate with their counterparts in other organizations - regardless of their business sector, i.e. business, not-for-profit, faith-based, or other. Such inclusive change efforts have the very real possibility of becoming ingrained in your organization's DNA – the journey towards excellence!

We may each come to process excellence and Baldrige from a different perspective, but the common thread is one of leading through change – that change being the effort to drive process improvement in our organizations and in our lives.
